Mr. Sayre's indictment of Christlanity's failure to influence average men and wemen is summed up in the opening paragraph, thus:

"Christianity has lest its hold on the masses of the people. The industrial classes have ceased to be influenced by it. It has shrunk into a concern of the so-called middle and upper classes. This is a condition, which if allowed to continue, means that Christianity in America will soon enter definitely into the status of a decaying religion."




