### AS TO PERSONALITIES.

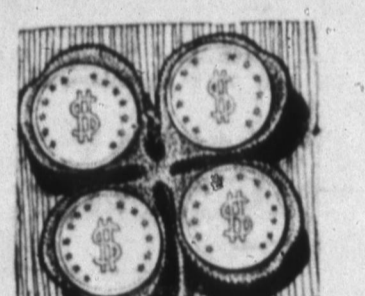
"There is no room for personalities in this campaign. Reflections upon the character or personal appearance of the President are not to be tolerated. One cannot review Mr. Coolidge's career or read his utterances or see him face to face without admiration. He is a man of great understanding of public matters, of high principles well considered, and of unquestioned probity. He is a calm and careful man. And he is at worst as good-looking as those who criticize his appearance. Of Mr. Davis I shall have more to say later in my speech. He is beyond all question an extraordinary man. Those who oppose him recognize his high qualifications for the Presidency. Responsible Republicans do not question his qualifications or his character. La Follette is a strong man, but no of presidential temperament. He is wrong, and all the more dangerously wrong because of his sincerity, his character and force. Of this I mean to speak at more length. Mr. Coolidge represents a false point of view a point of view that I oppose; and I shall show you about the courage of a President; he has all the dimensions of a President. And it is this that commends him to me. I care not a straw about his association with Mr. Morgan's bank. When Woodrow Wilson and Morgan agree on the same man as a lawyer it is conclusive evidence of his character and ability, as man and lawyer. Wilson made him Solicitor General of the United States; Morgan made him his lawyer. He was faithful in each relation, and in each he proved his ability. In his relations as lawyer he was open and above-board. His refusal to serve his relations with Morgan's Bank when a candidate for the nomination marked him as a man whose character may be relied upon. That is the sort of man we must always seek for the Presidency.

"So much for the personal aspects of the candidates for President. I regret that we cannot speak so well of any of the candidates for vice-president. We shall have to pray this year that the next president will not die. Dawes is an impossibility. The Republicans bid us to keep kool with Coolidge. We are too cool already with Coolidge; but I do not want to keep damning with Dawes. Bryan is not well qualified for the presidency; and Wheeler is unthinkable. Of the three Bryan is by odds the most acceptable.

### Great Question at Issue

"What are the great questions before us? They are five in number as follows:  
"1. The Prevention of War. This is the great modern problem Government, says Sancho Panza, was meant to make people happy, not to make war. In modern war there are no victors, all are vanquished, says a great statesman of France. This hits the nail on the head. What is involved in this campaign touching this great question? I propose to show you.  
"2. The next great modern question is the question of quality of Opportunity. Our Republic is dedicated to this ideal; but we all know that equality of condition and equality of opportunity are passing in our land. The power of the Government leans all in one direction.
