PAWTUCKET, R. I., Oct. 26,-The sporting craze is America's greatest sin, according to Rev. Arthur J Watson of St. Luke's Episcopal Church, known, internationally as the "fighting man of the cloth'.' And he predicts for America a trag ic downfall similar to that of encient Rome-unless a huge congroup sevival occurs.

The sporting craze in this country is the indirect cause of most of our financial erfmes, and we squander more money on baseball, horse thethan on flood and famine sufferers, Rev. Watson declared.

To Build Character


"As long as it builds character athletics is desirable',' Rev. Watson continued, " 'but most of America's sporting craze is the indirect cause of most of our financial crimes.
