

### TO DISTRIBUTE FUND NEXT YR.

**Reduction Money to Be Available at End 6 Months Terms**

**SALMON, Aug. 1.**—The more than a million dollars allotted to the special tax districts operating schools for a longer period than six months, known as the \$1,250,000 tax reduction fund, will not be actually distributed to the school authorities until early next year, probably in February and March, after the expiration of the six months' constitutional term, it is believed by officials here.

Some of the schools in mountain counties, including Alleghany, Ashe and others in the western sections have already started, or will start soon, in order to finish the six months' term before the hardest of the winter comes in January and February. To those counties, which will appear, it is probable that the funds will be distributed sooner, or as they are needed, but for schools in general the distribution will probably not be made until February and March, when they are needed for the extended term.

The law provides that the man equibating fund be distributed in four installments, these will be made probably in two before and two after the Christmas holidays, except in those cases in which the funds are needed earlier, which are the exception. In these cases the likelihood is that the funds will be sent out as they are needed.

In case of the tax reduction fund,

however, the law does not specify when or by what methods it is to be distributed. The belief is expressed by Leroy Martin, secretary of the State Board of Equalization which handles the funds, and Dr. A. T. Allen, State superintendent of public instruction, that it will be distributed after the six months' term funds have been distributed and as it is needed for the extended term.

By that time, Dr. Allen points out, some of the money will be made available from the collection of income taxes, due March 15, without the requirement that the State borrow money for the fund in anticipation of taxes to be collected. In case the funds in the treasury are low at the time,

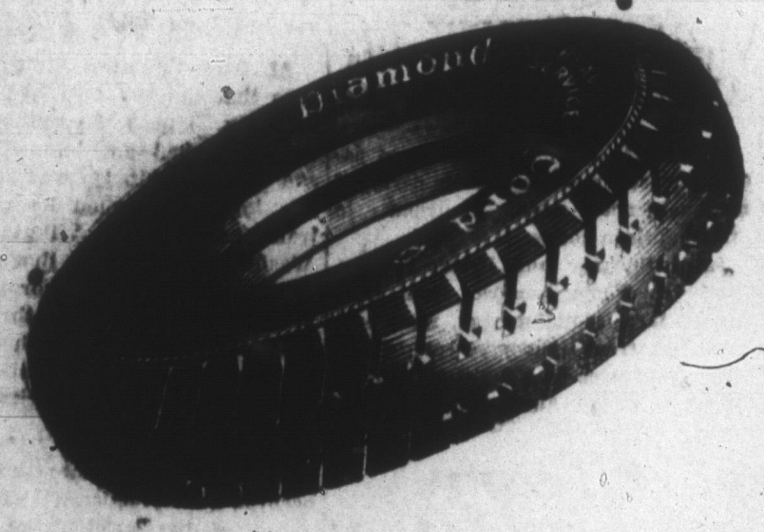
