Passed Away Yesterday Afternoon After an Illness of Ten Days—Funeral at 2 p. m. To-day—Was the Widow of the Late Mr. Thomas Wilson. Yesterday afternoon at 5 o'clock Mrs. Love Ann Wilson died at the home of her son, Mr. M. T. Wilson, on Main street after an illness of ten days. Although not entirely unexpected Mrs. Wilson's death came as a severe shock to her family and friends, who have the sympathy of the entire community in their bereavement.

The funeral will be held at 2 o'clock this afternoon from the Associate Reformed Presbyterian church, of which she had long been a consistent and loyal member. Dr. J. C. Galloway, the pastor, will conduct the funeral rites, after which the body will be laid to rest in the family plot in the city cemetery. On account of the absence from town of Mr. Charles Ford, who will have charge of the funeral of Dr. O'Donoghue at Belmont, Mr. W. T. Rankin will have charge of the funeral services.

The pall bearers will be Messrs. Ed Whitesides, R. W. Carson, A. M. Smyre, J. A. Hunter, J. D. Moore, and J. P. Reid.

Love Ann Wilson was born November 3rd, 1831, in the Gould neighborhood of this county, thus being at the time of her death 73 years, 1 month and 2 days of age. She was a daughter of the late Ezra B. Wilson and a granddaughter of the late William J. Wilson, who was for 40 years register of deeds of Lincoln county. Of the immediate family there survive two brothers, Messrs. S. M. and James J. Wilson, both of whom live on the old home place, and one sister, Mrs. Sarah Carroll of Crowders Creek.

On September 30th, 1852, she was married to Mr. Thomas Wilson. Though of the same name they were not related. Her husband, who was for many years a prominent citizen of the county, preceded her to the grave two years, having died at Charlotte December 16th, 1902, in the seventy-fifth year of his age. From the time of their marriage till they moved to Gastonia ten years ago, Mr. and Mrs. Wilson lived at his old home place near where the Arlington mill now stands. For the past year Mrs. Wilson had made her home with her son, Mr. M. T. Wilson, where she died.

To this union there were born thirteen children, seven of whom survive as follows: R. L. Wilson of Dallas; Dr. W. H. Wilson of Lenoir; Samuel T. Wilson of Dallas, R. B. Wilson, M. T. Wilson, and E. F. Wilson of Gastonia, and Mrs. John Anthony of Pisgah. The children who have died are: an infant, Elizabeth Amelia; James Monroe; Mrs. Lorena J. Falls, wife of Mr. Robert J. Falls; Mrs. James Niell, who died March 11, 1891; and Mrs. S. E. McArthur, who died Feb. 18, 1903. Twenty-seven grandchildren survive.

In her girlhood the deceased joined the Presbyterian church and remained a member of the same till the time of her marriage when she joined the Associate Reformed Presbyterian church. For many years she held her membership at the Pisgah church but moved to Gastonia when the church here was established.

Deceased was a first cousin of Mrs. J. K. Dixon of Gastonia and of the late Mrs. Eli N. Lineberger.
