BAPTISTS ACQUIRE PROPERTY.

The congregation of the First Baptist church has acquired a very valuable piece of property, located on the southwest corner of Franklin avenue and South street. The deal was closed Wednesday night at a meeting of the church members. The lot has a frontage of 173 feet on Franklin avenue and is 150 feet deep. The price paid was \$6, 000. The purchase was made from Mr. R. P. Rankin, the owner. On the western end of the lot is a two-story frame res-

parsonage is to be erected on this property. The parsonage is to be in the shape of a memorial to her husband, the late Capt, J. D. It is the intention of this congregation to build a handsome church edifice on the corner of this property. This will not be done at any early date, however, as this congregation already has a church which is practically

new, on the corner of Long and Marietta streets. This newly acquired property is one of the best close-in pieces of real estate in town and the purchasers are fortunate in gaining possession of it.
