—A young man named Hendricks died early this morning at the Loray boarding house following an illness lasting only since Saturday. His father and mother, who live at the Chadwick Mill, Charlotte, are here. Burial will be in the Loray cemetery. Mr. Hendricks was about 18 years of age and was a member of the Loray Baptist church.

—Before Magistrate T. H. White yesterday afternoon at the city hall Mr. James Warren, of the Boogertown section, was tried on a charge of slander and was held for trial at the next term of Gaston Superior Court, his bond being fixed at \$200. The alleged slander was uttered against Mrs. Jack Price of the Boogertown community. The court room was packed by spectators.

—Sunday was "Mothers' Day," a day which is annually coming to be observed with uniformity in all sections of the country. ENGLAND'S KING DEAD.

Edward the Seventh Passes Away After Illness of One Week—All England Mourns His Loss—His Eldest Son, George the Fifth, Succeeds to the Throne.

King Edward VII of England died Friday night at 11:45 o'clock in Buckingham palace, London, following a serious illness of only one week. Only ten days previous he had returned to England from a trip for his health. It is stated that the king's friends were convinced that worry over the critical political situation which confronted him, with sleepless nights, aggravated if it did not cause his fatal illness.

King Edward's eldest son, George V, Prince of Wales, succeeded to the throne and took the oath of office Saturday. The coronation ceremony was attended by the usual pomp and splendor. Business and amusements of all kinds were suspended and the entire nation mourned.

The dead king was born at Buck-

ingham palace, London, November 9, 1841. He was christened Albert Edward in St. George's chapel, Windsor on January 25, 1842, King Frederick William of Prussia standing sponsor. He was educated in England and on the continent by tutors from 1849 to 1858. On November 9, 1859, he took military rank as colonel, unattached, with promise of the Garter. On July 25, 1860, he landed in Canada for a visit as representative of Queen Victoria. He arrived in the United States at Detroit, Mich., September 20, 1860. Accompanied by President Buchanan and members of his cabinet he planted a chestnut tree at the tomb of George Washington at Mount Vernon. After three days of festivities in New York city he sailed for England October 15, 1861. In that year he entered Cambridge University as a student. In September, 1861, he met his future queen, then Princess Alexandra, of Denmark. He took his seat in the House of Lords for the first time in 1863. He married Princess Alexandra at St. George's Chapel, Windsor, March 10, 1863. In 1874 he was elected grandmaster of the Freemasons of England. He ascended the throne on the death of Queen Victoria Jan. 22, 1901, and died May 6, 1910.

The career of the new King George V is told briefly as follows:

1865, June 3—Born at Malborough House, London.

1877—Becomes naval cadet, and spends two years on Britannia.

1880-1885—Advanced from midshipman to lieutenant.

1891—Advanced to rank of commander.

1892—On death of brother, Prince Albert Victor, becomes heir apparent.

1893, July 6—Married Princess Victoria May of Teck.

1901—Advanced to rank of rear admiral. With consort, visits British possessions of the world, including Canada. At Niagara Falls day President McKinley was shot at Buffalo. Visits Buffalo informally. Created Prince of Wales in November.

1903—Advanced to rank of admiral.

1905—Visits India.

1907—Visits Scotland, residing at Holyrood palace, Edinburgh.

1908—Attends Quebec tercentenary celebration in July.

Sec. 28. At least five days preceding such primary election every person desiring to become a candidate for any county or legislative office shall signify his intention, in writing, to the chairman of the County Democratic Executive Committee, and at the same time shall deposit such fee as the said chairman may determine to be his pro rata part of the expense of printing and distributing proper tickets; and every such person shall also subscribe to a pledge that he will abide by the result of the primary election and support the successful candidate or candidates chosen in said primary election.

Tickets as prescribed will be furnished by the chairman and no other ticket will be counted in the primary.

Files Petition in Bankruptcy.

The Poole Grocery Company yesterday filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy. The firm's nominal assets are about \$9,400, about \$5,000 of which is in open accounts, with liabilities of about \$6,100. There are preferred and secured debts to the sum of about \$750. Mr. W. H.
