The cost of eradicating the cattle tick in certain Mississippi counties has been fifty cents for each head of cattle in those counties. The average increase in the value of these cattle because of tick eradication is estimated at \$7 per head. In other words these counties spent \$100,000 for tick eradication and received at once a return of \$2,148,000 in the increased value of their cattle. Yet there are still some farmers and a few misinforming newspapers who claim that ticks can't be eradicated, or if they can, "it doesn't pay" to do it!—The Progressive Farmer.
