His father was a coal minor in a typical coal mining town with its rows of small, untrinted smalle begrimed houses. The recent strong improvement in the market for municipal securities should be taken advantage of promptly by Southern communities which are contemplating the issuing of bonds for public work. A vast amount of county, city and municipal improvements of every kind is needed in the South, for which bonds must be issued. At the present time there is a better market for such securities, and coincident with this ability to get money there is a surplus of labor available, and manufacturers of machinery and equipment are in a position to fill orders to better advantage than would be possible if all business interests were active. The condition, therefore, is exceptionally favorable for the prosecution of public work.

Throughout all parts of the South and Southwest roads are to be built, new streets made and old streets improved, sewerage systems and waterworls are to be constructed or ontarged, and public buildings crout. ed. While it is desirable, and often important, that public buildings should be ornate and in Leening with the life of the community, it is especially important that they should be absolutely firetrooff. EVENY courthouse and every city hall ought to be so well constructed as to make thoroughly safe public records of all linds These thirds are important. But the construction of the most modern sewerage systems, and of water-works to guarantee an amote supply of pure water; and the build ing of good roads and the paytne of streets and alleys are even more maportant. 
