INFLUENZA SITUATION IS GREATLY IMPROVED.

Dr. C. J. McCombs, city physician, hands The Gazette the following very encouraging report on the influenza situation:

"There has been a great improvement in the influenza situation during the last week. It may be a temporary checking up or it may be permanent. Let us hope that it is the latter.

"During the week ending December 10 there were 60 new cases developed, and there were only 42 new cases during the last week ending last night, and a number of these rather light. For the last three days there have been only seven cases reported, showing that a very large per cent of these 42 cases were reported the first few days of the week.

"It looks at present as if there will be no danger of having to postpone the opening of the schools after the holidays."
