NOTICE OF CITY PRIMARY ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that there will be held a City Primary Election for the nomination of candidates for the office of City Council for the City of Gastonia on

Monday, April 28th, 1919.

from 7 o'clock a. m. until sunset at the City Hall of Gastonia, North Carolina, said candidates to be nominated at large from the said City. No names shall be placed upon the general ballot at the City Elections except those nominated at such primary according to the provisions of the law.

All persons desiring to become candidates for nomination for the office of City Council by said primary must, at least ten days before said primary election file with the City Clerk of Gastonia a statement of such candidates in substantially the following form:

State of North Carolina, County of Gastonia.

I, _____ hereby give notice that I reside at _____ Street, City of Gastonia, County of Gastonia, State of North Carolina; that I am a candidate for nomination to the office of City Council to be voted upon at the primary election to be held on the fourth Monday in April, 1919, and I hereby request that my name be printed upon the official ballot for the nomination by such primary election for such office.

Said candidate shall at the same time pay to said City Clerk the sum of \$5.00 to be turned over to the City Treasurer.

Said Primary Election shall be held under laws as set forth in Chapter 136 Public Laws, 1917, sub-chapter IV. The ten candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be the only candidates whose names shall be placed upon the ballot for the City Council composed of five members, at the General Election.

W. M. Nolen, of Gastonia, N. C., has been appointed registrar and George R. Hawkins and R. N. Wilson, of said City, have been appointed judges for said election. The registrar will be furnished registration books which he will have open at the City Hall on the four consecutive Saturdays next preceding said election between the hours of 7 o'clock a. m. and 7 o'clock p. m., and all persons entitled to register and vote who have not already registered and are entitled to vote will apply to him for registration at such times and place.

The above primary will not be held as above set forth if the City Manager Plan is not adopted by election on April 16th, 1919, as has been advertised.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA NEWS.

CHAPEL HILL, March 31. Much interest and importance are attached to the announcement just made here that Franklin K. Lane, Secretary of the Interior and member of President Wilson's cabinet since 1912, will deliver the annual Commencement Day address at the University on June 18.

It is seldom that the security of the student body of the University get as certain of our time as the same and the present social conditions, exchange of good fellowship and the like, and this is a very important matter. The college men in the largest social event yet presented this year, was staged in Swan Hall Friday night under most propitious circumstances.

Sumptuous provisions had been made for the entertainment of the boys, with the result that the whole affair went off in the best style. At the appointed hour text books were cast aside and freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors, faculty members and their wives, coeds, townspeople, and visitors, between 600 and 700 in number, all crowded into the spacious hall and mingled in an atmosphere that promotes nothing short of good feeling and cheer.

The movement to erect a Graham Memorial Building on the campus of the University in honor of the late President Edward Kildor Graham is now in full swing, according to reports being received by Secretary Albert M. Coates. Practically the entire State has been organized for the work of raising the funds and splendid progress is being made by the directors in each community. Alumni meetings have recently been held in several communities in the State, for the purpose of appointing local directors of the movement. Among the large contributions being received by Secretary Coates are five checks from five alumni in New York City, three of which were for \$2,000 each, while two amounted to \$1,000 each. Similarly many checks of \$1,000 each have been received from alumni and non-alumni citizens of the State.

Great interest is being manifested in the forthcoming High School debates as the date for the first preliminaries, April 4th, fast approaches. A total of 180 schools have entered the union, which is a splendid showing when the effects of the influenza situation and the war are taken into consideration. The second triangular series will be held on April 25th, while the final contest will be staged in Chapel Hill on May 1st and 2nd.

WASHINGTON, March 31. The Supreme Court today denied the petition of the attorneys of Eugene V. Debs for a rehearing. Debs must serve 10 years, having been convicted of violation of the Espionage laws.
