

Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with action of the board of county commissioners, taken on Monday, May 5, 1919, upon petition of the county board of education, an election will be held on Saturday, June 7, 1919

in School District No. 1, River Bend township, in Gaston county, which school district embraces the incorporated town of Stanley, to ascertain whether the voters of said school district are in favor of ssning bonds in the sum of ten thousand dollars 1\$10,000 , bearing interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, said bonds to run for a term of twenty (20) years, for the purpose of building a school house and furnishing the same with suitable equipment. The maximum tax to be levied in said district to pay the interest on said bonds and to create a sinking fund for the purpose of paying the interest and principal of said bonds to be fifty (50) cents on each one hundred dollars valuation of property and ninety (90) cents on each
