## NEWS NOTES.

Dr. A. L. E. De Stuers, Dutch minister at Paris since 1887, died Monday in Paris, aged 78.

Secretary of War Baker and 4,082 troops arrived at New York Monday on the George Washington.

The special term of State Superior Court, held in February for the trial of the Winston-Salem slavers, cost the sixth county nearly \$4,000.

Davison's debaters won over Washington and Lee in the annual debate between those institutions at Davison College Monday night. The question the debate was, "Resolved, That the railroads should be owned and operated by the United States government."

The Greenville & Western, a bankrupt railroad running from Greenville, S. C., to River Falls, a distance of 25 miles, was sold at public sale Monday by order of the Federal court. R. A. McTyer, of Orlando, Fla., former president of the company was the purchaser and the price was \$75,000.

Governor Bickett, of Mississippi, Mayor South of Jackson, and Frederick Sulzberger, editor of a Jackson newspaper, all received through the mails Monday six picture looking packages. They thought they had received "confidential machines" as did many prominent men in the country a few days ago but investigation disclosed the fact that somebody was playing a practical joke on them.

Matthew Hale, president of the Liberty Shipbuilding Co., of Wilmington, and president of the South Atlantic Maritime corporation, has no fears that the shipping board will refuse the south's request for 14 ships to be used in trade between the five South Atlantic ports and the Latin Americas. The board decides in Washington tomorrow.

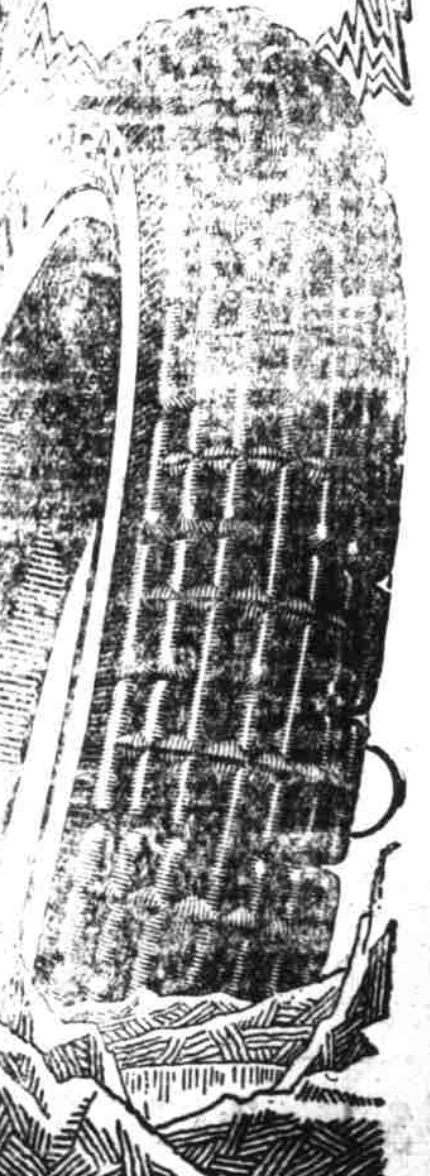
