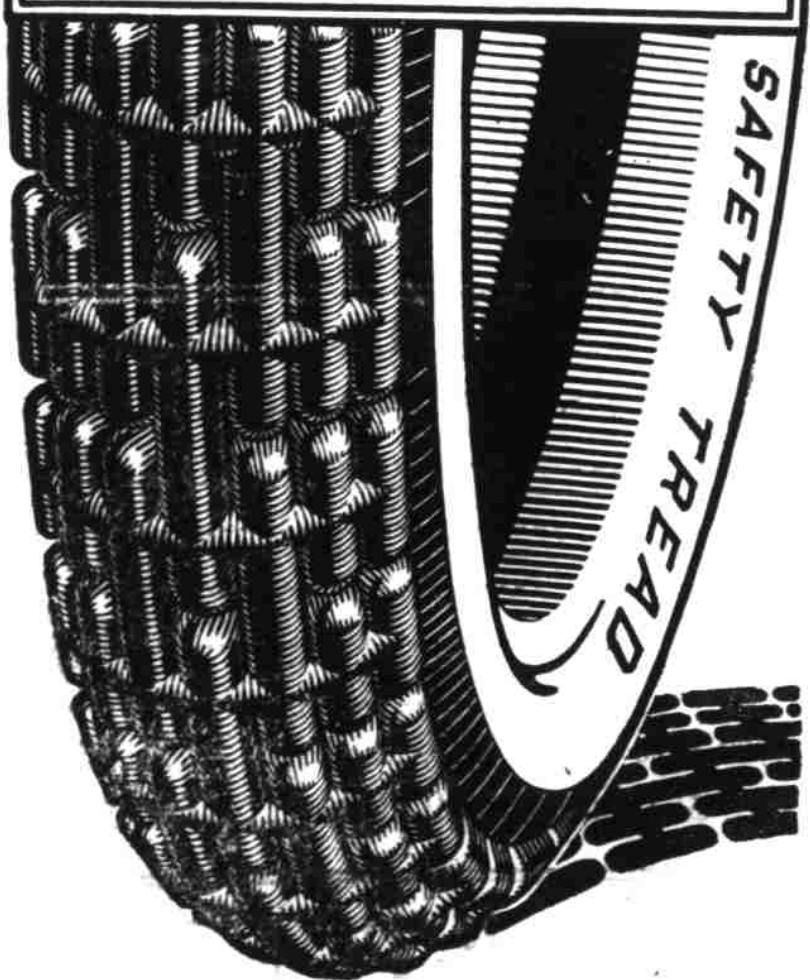

ZURICH, June 4.—The constitution committee of the German national assembly has voted on the question of whether the German officials should be surrendered for trial on war guilt charges in foreign courts, and a formal dispatch to Paris.

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SPEECH OF WILLIAM H. LEWIS AT YADKIN COLLEGE, MAY, 29, 1919.
 Ladies and gentlemen, classmates and friends: Not expecting to be called up on for a regular speech, of course I shall not be able to make one. However, I wish to assure you that two ideas are uppermost in my mind at this moment: the one is a sense of pleasure, and the other a feeling of regrets. The pleasure consists in being back at this time at my old Alma Mater, and seeing and being with so many of my old friends and school mates, and reverting in my mind to the joyous scenes and blissful realities of my young manhood, when I had hopes for a useful career of service to my fellow-man, and helpfulness to humanity; and looking forward to the time when I could be reasonably successful in the course that I was about to pursue, get me a good wife, and an humble home, and rear a happy family, and get ready to die. How well I have succeeded in the latter part of this program you may learn by visiting me in my humble cottage on South Street, in Gastonia, N. C.
 The feeling of regrets to which I refer, consist in: In observing that so many of those whom I knew and loved are gone hence to parts unknown, some have moved away, no doubt, and others have gone to their reward. Then, that the future holds out no hope to any of us, who are as old as I am today, that we will be able to answer the roll call in this good place 15 years hence. NEARLY 100 PERSONS KILLED IN COAL MINE EXPLOSION.

WILKESBARRE, PENN., June 5.—Seventy-five to 100 persons were killed by a powerful explosion at the Baltimore Mine No. 2 of the Delaware & Hudson Co., this morning. Many were injured. The force of the explosion was terrific, being heard five miles. Rescuers found the dead bodies in the tunnels. Some were found to be dead, others were suffocated while trying to escape. A can of black powder in the mine exploded 200 feet inside the mine when sparks fell from an imperfect hoist connection.
