WEDNESDAY'S TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

(By International News Service.)

BERLIN, June 25.—Vorquartz in an article today declares that the peace pact agreed upon is valid only so long as the powers which dictated it exist. "The peace is due to compulsion and without the selfishness Germany never will forget the injuries suffered in this war."

PARIS, June 25.—The commanders of the French, American and British armies of occupation in Germany were notified that the Reichslanders were preparing hostile demonstrations. When peace was signed the troops were warned that an amnesty would be proclaimed immediately after the signing of the treaty.

PARIS, June 25.—Unless the German government announces the personnel of the new peace delegation by this evening, the Allies will send a note to Weimar calling Premier Bauer to order in sharpest terms, reminding him that patience there is exhausted. In the meantime Foch is instructed to hold his troops ready.

NEW YORK, June 25.—With 6 days only before the advent of nationwide prohibition unless President Wilson, in his annual message today in Madison Square Garden, were working on the largest job the world ever saw. The administration will be 12. The manager is charged to keep a tight rein on the theatrical performers and accompanying the affair.

WASHINGTON, June 25.—The split in the Republican majority controlling the senate foreign relations committee has resulted in a failure to report to the senate this afternoon. The Fall resolution declaring that war between the United States and Germany no longer exists, and directing the President immediately to withdraw all American soldiers from Germany, was lost by a vote of 12 to 4. The Wisconsin senator, though with only 12 votes on the measure, was carried, Senator Lodge and the other Republicans voted with the Democrats. Johnson, of California, Bryan, of Missouri, and Fall opposed the resolution. The majority of the committee contended that no action be taken until they were officially notified that Germany has actually signed the treaty.

WASHINGTON, June 25.—The signing of the treaty will have no effect upon the policy of the War Department regarding the removal of American troops from France. General March stated today. Ever since the signing of the armistice it has been the aim of the department to get the men back as quickly as possible. As to the army of occupation that is a matter in the hands of international law but the department is ready to expedite the moving as soon as word comes that they may be released.

WASHINGTON, June 25.—The restoration of full powers to the Interstate Commerce Commission over railroads, bridges and regulations were proposed by Hines today, when he appeared before the House committee, considering the bill. Hines said the relations between the two organizations were so cordially harmonizing as to be regulated by the passage of the bill.

MILLION TROOPS STOOD READY TO ENFORCE TERMS.
