Saturday, the 26th Day of July, 1919, at the hour of 11 o'clock, p. m., at the court house door of Lincoln County in Lincolnton, N. C., the following described real estate, including the cotton mill, tenant houses, machinery, apparatus, and equipment belonging to the cotton mill located on said property, the same being more particularly bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

First Tract: Lying and being in Catawba Springs Township, Lincoln County above State, beginning at a stone on the west side of the public road in front of the old Bollinger house place, same formerly being a corner of J. G. Morrison, now Lloyd Cotton Mills, and R. H. Morrison, and running S 64 1/2 W 18 poles to a stone on the south side of a branch; thence N 2 W 40 poles to a stone, corner of J. F. Reinhardt, M. J. 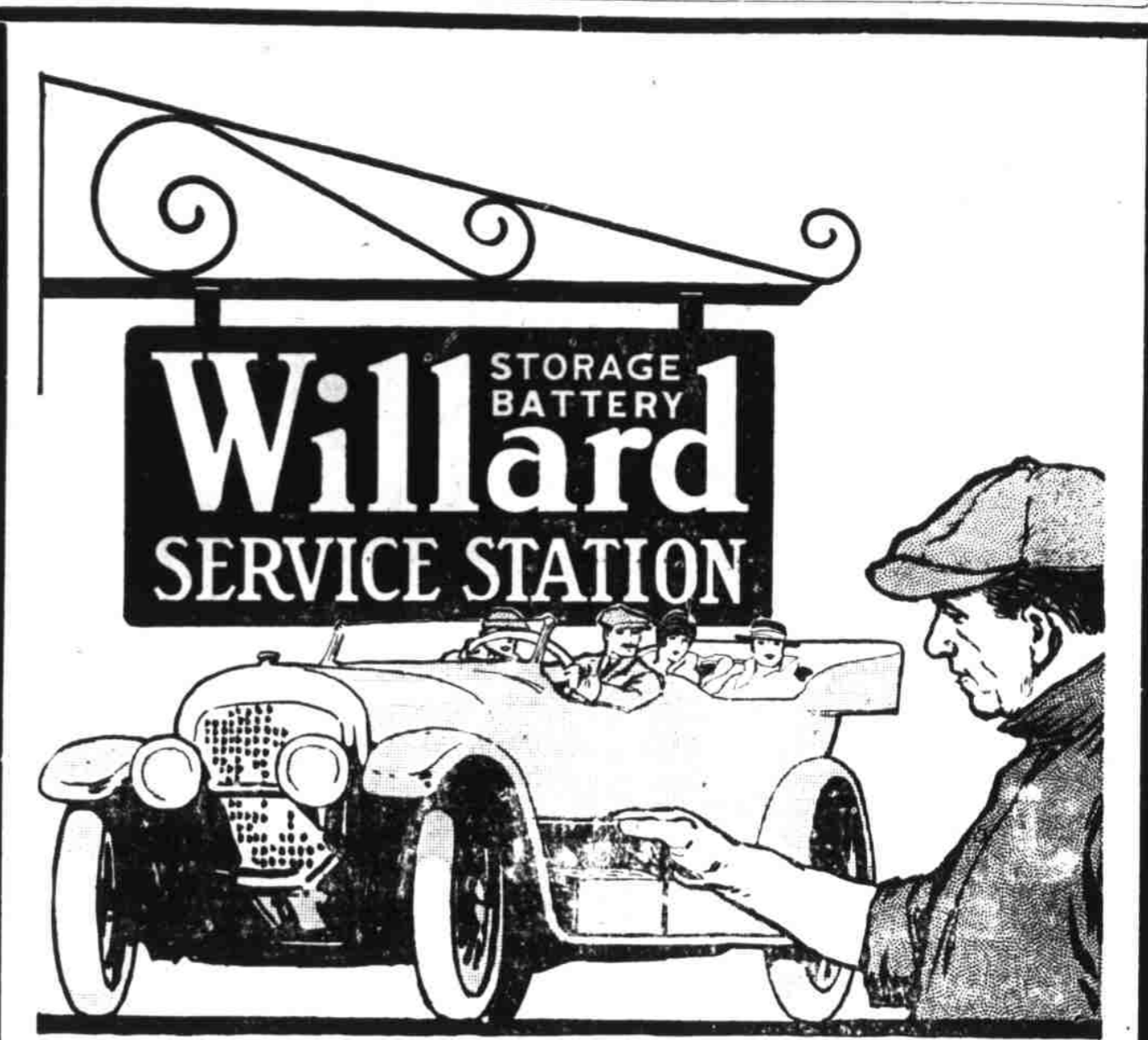
