Mr. Shuford Sells Farm.

Mr. S. S. Shuford yesterday sold his farm in the Point section of York county to Messrs. John L. and J. D. B. Curran. The farm was secured by Mr. Shuford in 1914 and is the place known as the Len Wood farm. It is a valuable tract of land, consisting of 526 acres. Mr. Curran has also recently bought from Mr. Hope Adams at Ebenezer, S. C., his farm of 150 acres or more.

Mr. Shuford has not as yet announced his plans for the future.

Annual Meeting.

The annual meeting of the stockholders and directors of the Gastonia County Farmers Mutual Fire Insurance Company was held here Monday. All the officers were re-elected, Mr. E. D. Thompson, of Stanley, being president and Mr. J. R. Henderson, of the Union neighborhood, secretary and treasurer. Reports of the officers showed the organization to be in a flourishing condition. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 1919, the company had total losses of only \$265 on over a million dollars insurance in force. Mr. J. R. Henderson was in the city today looking after the adjustment of the loss on the big barn belonging to the estate of the late J. Frank McArver, which was burned Monday night. There were two policies, one for \$1,000 on the large barn and \$700 on its contents and another for \$100 on a smaller building, making a total of \$1,900 insurance, which covered, however, only a small part of the loss.

MILLIONS SAVED IN EDUCATION BY METRICS.

Noted Educators Declare Metric Measures Would Mean Great Saving.

San Francisco, Aug. 6.—America's greatest educators are supporting the move made by the World Trade Club of San Francisco to secure the adoption of metric units of weights and measures by Brittain and the United States. "The adoption of the metric system by the United States would facilitate teaching of mathematics and applied sciences in schools," wires President Emeritus Charles W. Eliot, of Harvard University. President Nicholas Murray Butler of Columbia has also sent the World Trade Club a telegram of support. Dr. Joseph V. Collins, an eminent educator, declares that the people of the United States lose \$314,000,000 yearly in education because of the time wasted in teaching a system so much more complicated and difficult than the metric system.

DESTRUCTIVE WORM FOUND ON GASTON COUNTY FARMS.

Worm Closely Resembling the Army Worm Discovered in Two Sections of Gaston County—Threatens All Green Crops—Remedy Given to Check Its Spreading.

County Demonstration Agent C. Lee Gowan has discovered a worm in Gaston county that is threatening to play havoc with this year's crops unless its spreading is checked in the very near future. The worm, which has already been discovered on farms in two sections of the county, closely resembles the army worm in appearance and its destructive work.

All green crops including corn and cotton are threatened by the worm which is described as being one to one and half inches in length, of the caterpillar type, having black stripes on its sides with a yellowish-gray stripe down its back. Mr. Gowan has collected several specimens of

the worm and sent them to the State entomologist at Raleigh. He expects a report on the worm within the next few days.

The destructive work of the worm was first discovered on the farm of Mr. C. W. Gostner, near Italia. It has also been found on the Hendricks farm west of Gastonia.

The following remedy for checking the spread of the worm is given by Mr. Gowan: One pound of powdered arsenate of lead with 25 gallons of water, the solution to be sprayed on the crops infested. Another remedy is to dig steep ditches around the crops on which the worms are found, leaving the sides straight. The ditches check the spread of the worms because they are unable to climb the steep sides of the ditches.

Mr. Gowan declared yesterday that at this time the prevalence of these worms had not been reported found in but two sections of the county but because of the rapidity with which they spread every effort should be made to check them.

given the typhoid vaccination treatment during the month of July, according to a statement made by Dr. C. J. McCombs, city physician, yesterday. This treatment which is free to all persons, will be given a Gastonia citizen by Dr. McCombs at his office every morning during the week from 8 to 9 o'clock.

Dr. McCombs said yesterday that he was anxious to give the treatment to a much larger number and stressed the fact that if the people would take advantage of the opportunity offered them by the State Board of Health the city would soon be made immune against typhoid. "There were nine cases of typhoid fever in the city last month and several other cases have been reported this month," Dr. McCombs said, "and while there is not a prevalence of the disease in the city too much precaution cannot be taken."

He urges that the treatment be taken by all.
