THE SOUTH ATLANTIC EXPORT COMPANY.

Details of Organization Completed at Columbia, S. C., Last Saturday. Atlanta, Ga., Oct. 17.—With the organization of the South Atlantic Export Company, final details of which were completed at Columbia, S. C., Saturday, Georgia and the South will go after foreign trade as they have not done before in their history.

Atlanta, which has been the temporary headquarters of the company, has been made the permanent headquarters. It was thought for a time that these headquarters would be moved to Columbia, but no change will be made on account of the fact that the territory to be covered by the company has been extended westward, putting Atlanta nearer its center.

J. A. Von Dollen, of Atlanta, who has been secretary since the organization was started will continue in that position, having been elected at the final organization meeting.

It is stated that the company has already nine ships operating to South America and West Indian ports, and the federal shipping board has promised more as soon as the business warrants.

Four South Atlantic States, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and Florida, are represented in the company, which is in a large measure a "League of Southern Cities."

The official board is as follows: Matthews Hale, of Washington, D. C., president; E. P. Wharton, of Greensboro, N. C., vice president for North Carolina; Charles H. Barron, of Columbia, S. C., vice president for South Carolina; Hollins B. Randolph, of Atlanta, for Georgia; and Lorenzo Wilson, of Jacksonville, for Florida.

Messrs. Wharton, Barron, S. K. Brown, of Brunswick, Ga., and George H. Malby, of Jacksonville, Fla., were chosen as members of the executive committee.

There is an assistant treasurer for each of the four South Atlantic states: R. G. Vaughan, for North Carolina; Fulton C. Rogers, of Columbia, for South Carolina; William Mason, Jr., of Jacksonville, for Florida; and the Georgia assistant treasurer to be selected.

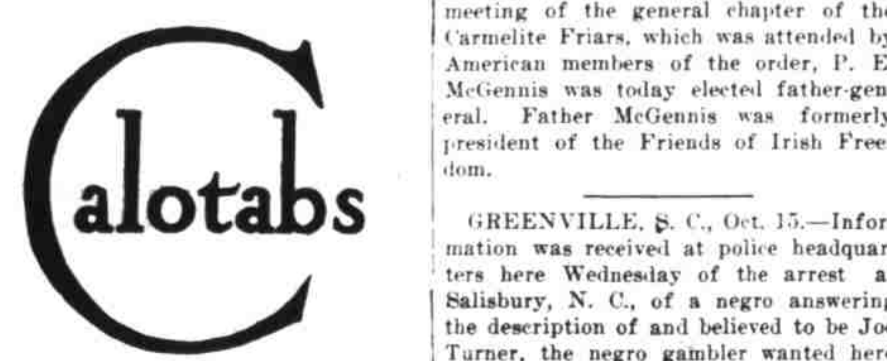
