DETROIT JAILS FULL OF REDS.

DETROIT, Mich., Nov. 10.—Virtually every Detroit police station, jail and other place of confinement today held at least a few of the federal prisoners, alleged radical agitators rounded up in raids begun last week. It was indicated today that efforts to check activities of the alleged disciples of direct action would be continued for some time.

All told, approximately 1,000 persons have been arrested in the summer months were taken to the city and Algonquin and further arrests are expected, the authorities estimated.

Raleigh, Nov. 10.

The Baptist State Convention meets in Raleigh today morning in its 89th annual session, a feature of the convention being the 75 Million Dollar Campaign. Arrangements have been made for entertaining the visiting Baptists.

Dr. B. W. Spillman, of Winston, will call the convention to order Tuesday morning. The opening sermon will be preached by Rev. A. Clyde Turner, pastor of the First Baptist church of Greensboro. In the afternoon of the first day's session the "Wis" of the 75 Million Dollar Campaign will be discussed, and the "What" of the campaign comes up for settlement Tuesday night.

NEW SCHEME FOR ASCERTAINING COTTON PRICES.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10.—Arrangements are being completed by the department of agriculture by which cotton planters and others interested in the price of cotton soon will be able to obtain actual cotton prices of the different grades of cotton in the various primary markets and especially of the ten lower grades of cotton not deliverable on future contracts. These price reports will be issued from Memphis, Atlanta, New Orleans, Dallas and Charlotte for the districts surrounding those cities and will be telephoned or telegraphed at the expense of the receiver or mailed free, to any subscriber for them. The quotations are based on the actual prices at which the seed is bought and sold in each district.

Steamer in Distress.

BOSTON, Nov. 10.—The slipping tugboat West Haven, towing the disabled freighter West Hematite, sent word ashore today that because she had been leaking nine days and was reaching the limits of her oil supply she would have to put into Vineyard Haven tomorrow morning. The West Haven, bound probably from La Palms for Norfolk, will have to dry dock for repairs as soon as possible. The West Hematite, bound from Havre for New York, has been without oil since November 2.

The Kanawa has found no trace of the crew of the Polar Land after a four hour search in the vicinity of the lost ship's position, reported before she went down, according to a wireless message from the Kanawa today.

NATIONAL COUNCIL WOMEN IN SESSION AT ST. LOUIS.

ST. LOUIS, MO., Nov. 10.—Women prominent in social and business life from every state in the Union, are here today attending the opening session of the convention of the National Council of Women of the United States. An address by Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, of New York City, was the first of a large number of addresses to be made by women whose names have become prominent.

Mrs. Catt's address was the only one made to the convention today with the exception of the welcome on behalf of the State of Missouri by Governor Gardner, and welcome to the city of St. Louis made by Mayor Kiel, and the response to these welcomes by Mrs. Walter Miller, of the local committee.

However, in the next five days thirty-six addresses are scheduled, the speakers including: Miss Jane Addams, of Hull House, Chicago; Mrs. Truman H. Newberry, of Detroit; Mrs. J. E. Gables, of Los Angeles; Mrs. E. B. Duggett, of Attleboro, Mass.; Miss Kate Bruce, of Cleveland; Mrs. Robert E. Spier, of New York; Mrs. M. B. Franchery, of Madison, Wis.; Mrs. Nat S. Brown, of St. Louis; the Rev. Olympia Brown, Racine, Wis.; Mrs. W. Brown, of New York City; Mrs. Rose Houghton, of Seattle; Mrs. Frances E. Burns, of St. Louis, Mo.; Mrs. M. K. Miller, of New York; Miss Helen V. Rossell, of New York; and Mrs. J. M. Street, Danvers, Me.

The sessions will end Saturday, November 15.
