#### METHODISTS SAVE BELGIAN AND SERBIAN ORPHANS.

Southern Church Buys Homes in Brussuls and Belgrade and Supports Serbian Refugees in England.

The Centenary Commission of Methodist Episcoral Church, South, will specialize in caring for the children of Belgium, Serbia and other stricken countries of Europe, according to an innonneement made by Dr. W. B. Beens h amp, the director-general. Dr. Beauch amp and a Church Commission have just returned from Europes

For this purpose a large home, for merly a famous boys' school, has been purchased at Uccle, a suburb of Brus sels. Several hundred children can be accommodated in this building, and the Methodists will assume entire resopusibility for them and their future.

Another home has been bought at Belgrade, Servia, and here the under fed orphans of the Southern Slavs will be given medical attention and cared for. A staff of women physicians, occurred in Scotland, will be in charge of this

Still another orphanage has been taken over at Faversnam, England. This home already contains more than a hundred Serbian children, orphaned refugees who were taken from their homes during the Austrian invasion

Plight of Children Deporable. "One can scarcely imagine the plight of the Belgian and Serbian children," declared Dr. Beanchamp, "The mines of Northern France have been flowled or filled with concrete by the torrowns, and thousands of children will literally

#### METHODIST CHURCH ENTERS YPRES AND BRUSSELS.

Great Memorial Church Will Be Erected in Devastated Belgian City - Brussels to be Center of Large Enterprise on the Part of Southerns.

A great Methodist Church, creeted and maintained by the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, will be erested amid the rains of Ypres, in Belgium. This was stated today by 10, W. B. Reanchamp. director-general of the Centenary Commission, who, with Bisimp James Atkans, the bishop in charge of European mission fields, just returned from Belgium.

The city of Ypres, terribly decastated, will not be rebuilt in its entirety. The once magnificent (1.th Hall, the finest in the world, the Cathesiral, the town hall, the churches, and other large ruins will be left as a perpetual memorial.

On these the city mayor has caused signs to be erected, reading: "This is holy ground. No stone of this fabric may be taken away. It is a heritage for all civilized peoples.

#### A City of Memorials.

Ypres is a city of memorials. The British government has selected a site and will erect a great museum, as a meanument to her fallen heroes.

In the or more annual to inversals ses on North Canadian for 1949 as compared with hirs is indicated in tentative figures just compiled at the State sanatorium for the treatment of tuberalosis, these figures covering the first half of the present year.

The total number of deaths reported during the first six months this year is 1,428, which would indicate a total for the year of 2.856. The total number oc curing in 1918 caused by tuberculosis was 3.391. The indicated reduction for this year is 5.5, the most remarkable record ever recorded since accurate statistics have been kept in the State.

The situation in North Carolina is very different from many other sections of the country. In nearly all there has been an increase in cases and deaths from tuberculosis this year. Particu larly in New York State has the increase been so great as to cause considerable alarm, and a redoubling of efforts at prevention and cure. 
