CHILDREN'S DAY OBSERVED BY FIRST A. R. P. CHURCH.

Interesting Services Held Sunday, When Many of the Young People Exhibited Results of Splendid Training - Prizes Awarded-Cradle Roll Called.

(Reported for The Daily Gazette.) Instead of the usual 11 o'clock service at the Associate Reformed Presbyterian church Sabbath, exercises in connection with the observing of Children's Day were held.

First, a song, "To the Hills I Lift Mine Eyes," by the entire school. This was followed by Scripture reading, the 96th Ps. by Mrs. Elmer Spencer, assistant superintendent of primary department.

Next was a concert recitation of the 121st Psalm by first and second year Juniors. The perfect recitation revealed splendid memory work and training.

The singing of the Shepherd Song, the 23rd Ps., by a group of girls, each carrying a white shepherd's crook was very impressive. Miss Martha Whitesides played the piano accompaniment.

The third and fourth year Juniors recited perfectly in concert recitation the Ten Commandments. While these little ones do not now fully realize the depths of truth and foundation principles embodied in this Decalogue, yet in years to come this knowledge may prove to be a bulwark of defense in time of temptation and trial.

Miss Lorine Sloan, teacher of expression and English at Linwood College, very impressively recited, "The Great Guest Came," by Markham. Not only the children, for whom it was specially recited, but the entire audience enjoyed Miss Sloan's splendid interpretation of the thought in the mind of the author.

The next on the program was to have been a "talk to the children" by Dr. Galloway, but to the sincere regret of every one, Dr. Galloway was unable to be present on account of sickness. He had expressed a special desire to be present at this service, but we hope for him a speedy recovery.

"Our Guardian Angel," No. 79 in Bible Songs, was sung by the school. Prof. Grier then made an address to the parents on "The Relationship of Parents to the Primary Sabbath School."
