### Compensation Law Held Unconstitutional

NASHVILLE, TENN., Nov. 25.—Judge A. G. Rutherford, in the first circuit court, today held the workmen's compensation law, enacted by the last legislature, unconstitutional.

Among the objections urged by the court against the statute were that it was class legislation, not equally applicable to all members of the same class, that it did not give the employe adequate remedy, deprived the parties of the right to trial by jury, and was compulsory and not elective, as it purported to be. The act provided for an injured employe or his dependents being paid half his salary weekly for a time depending upon the extent of his injury.

### ATTORNEY-GENERAL BRINGS ACTION AGAINST CARTER

HARRISBURG, PA., Nov. 25.—Attorney General W. I. Schaefer today brought action in the Dauphin county court to forfeit the charter of the Slovenic Workmen's Benefit Union of Johnstown, on the ground that it contained a provision in its by-laws which permits the expulsion of any man who becomes a strike-breaker.

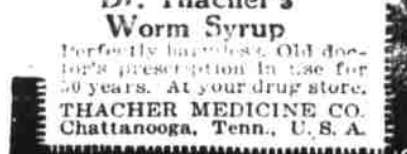
### Conspiracy to Assassinate Venizelos.
