To Be Given Another Chance. (By The Associated Press)

PARIS, Nov. 25.—Rumania is to be given another chance to sign the Austrian peace treaty, a limited period being named within which she may attach her signature. Permission to sign is also to be given Serbia.

The supreme council made this decision today, at the same time deciding that a protocol be opened on November 25 permitting Rumania to sign the peace treaty with Bulgaria within eight days. This period will also apply to her signature to the treaty of St. Germain with Austria.

A declaration was likewise decided upon to permit Serbia to sign the St. Germain treaty with the financial annexes and clause for the protection of racial minorities, to which the Jugos Slavs have objected.

NAPLES, Nov. 24.—Striking printers resumed work here today, being satisfied with an increase of wages amounting to 20 per cent, which was granted to meet the high cost of living.

Pulverized street rubbish and coal tar have been found to make good fuel briquettes in Amsterdam.
