Euphonious titles for tax measures will not make it any easier for the taxpayer to pay the tax bills he owes. The only permanent relief he can ever expect will come from the elimination of political waste in government and from drastic pruning of the bu-

reaucratie fungus that threatens to smother earnings and savings. In the meantime, the taxpayer can be helped by a new tax bill that will allow the easiest possible installment tax payments from current income for current taxes. Treasury officials should not give the horse laugh to ideas to aid the taxpayer. The bureaucrats don't pay the taxes. They should hump themselves to keep the taxpayer alive.

Cutting Bait

The phrase, "social security for everyone," is the new political bait being prepared to lure the voter. It is a fine sounding catch phrase.

Political planning of the lives of all the people in a nation can be carried too far, just as can parental planning of the lives of children—we face that danger in our country. The planners and spenders are beginning to outnumber the workers and savers.

Question: How should eggs be stored?

Answer: They should be stored in a cool, fairly moist, well-ventilated place. Moisture is just as necessary as keeping them cool. Both make for retaining good quality. Put them on a concrete floor, which has ben sprinkled, if possible. The best temperature for keeping eggs are between 40 and 60 degrees.
