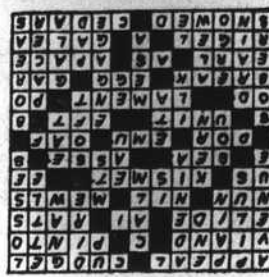
CROSSWORD PUZZLE

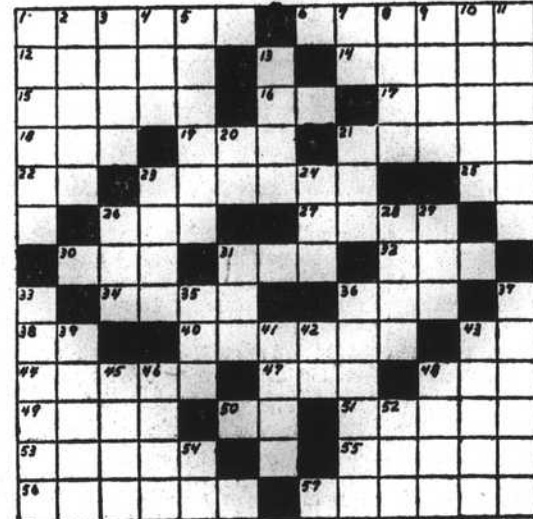
