### Modern Etiquette

Q—Is it proper for salesmen to say "good-by" to the reception girl when leaving a business office?

A—Yes. This is not only courteous, but also tactful. A small courtesy such as this is often remembered the next time the salesman calls.

Q—When men are being introduced across a table to one another, should they make any attempt to shake hands?

A—No; this would prove very awkward.

Q—Is it proper to repeat a person's name when you are acknowledging an introduction?

A—It is not only proper, but practical, too—because too many people fail to remember the names of persons to whom they are introduced. Repeating the name, as "How do you, Mrs. Johnson," helps to print the name in your memory.

Q—When a bride is writing notes of thanks to friends who do not know her husband, should the notes be signed with both names?

A—The signature should be her name only, but the note should say, "John and I deeply appreciate, etc."

Q—Is it proper to apply lipstick while at a restaurant table?

A—Yes, if you can do so quickly and inconspicuously.

Q—When a girl has been invited to several different bridal

showers for the same bride-elect, is it necessary that she bring a gift for each one?

A—If she attends each shower, it is required that she bring a gift to each one. However, it is not necessary that she attend all four or five showers for one girl if she feels she can't afford the expense of four or five gifts.

Q—Where do I put my gloves and radishes served at a formal dinner when there is no bread-and-butter plate?

A—Place them on the edge of the plate from which you are eating. Salt for the radishes goes there, too.

Q—I've just been told that "You're welcome" is out-of-date as an acknowledgment to "thank you." Is this correct?

A—Most certainly not.

Q—How long after refreshments are served should a guest remain at a bridge party?

A—This depends upon how early in the evening refreshments are served, but probably about 30 minutes after finishing is the usual time to leave. A guest at any affair should never "eat and run."

Q—Isn't it poor form for a woman, at her second marriage, to have three or four bridesmaids?

A—Yes. The second marriage should be as simple and informal as possible, and the bride should have but one attendant.

Q—Is it proper for the mother of a newborn baby to mail a printed card of thanks for a gift sent?

A—No; the mother's thanks should be expressed in a sincere, personally-written note.

Q—If one has not understood the name of a person to whom one has been introduced, what should he say?

A—It is in order to say, "I'm sorry; I did not quite understand the name."

Q—At a widow's second marriage, her first husband being deceased, should she invite the family of her first husband?

A—Yes, indeed, if the relationship has always been pleasant. And furthermore, these people should make every effort to attend.

Q—Is it proper to mail birth announcements to all one's friends, even to those whom one has telephoned the good news?

A—It would seem rather foolish to mail announcements to those persons who have already been told the news. But to all others, whether in town or far away—mailed announcements are proper.

Q—When an engagement has been broken, should the two persons involved return all presents to each other?

A—Yes; the man is expected to return all presents, letters and photographs he may have received from his fiancée; and she, of course, does the same.

Q—At an informal dinner, where there is no maid, who should start a dish around the table?

A—The person nearest to that dish.
