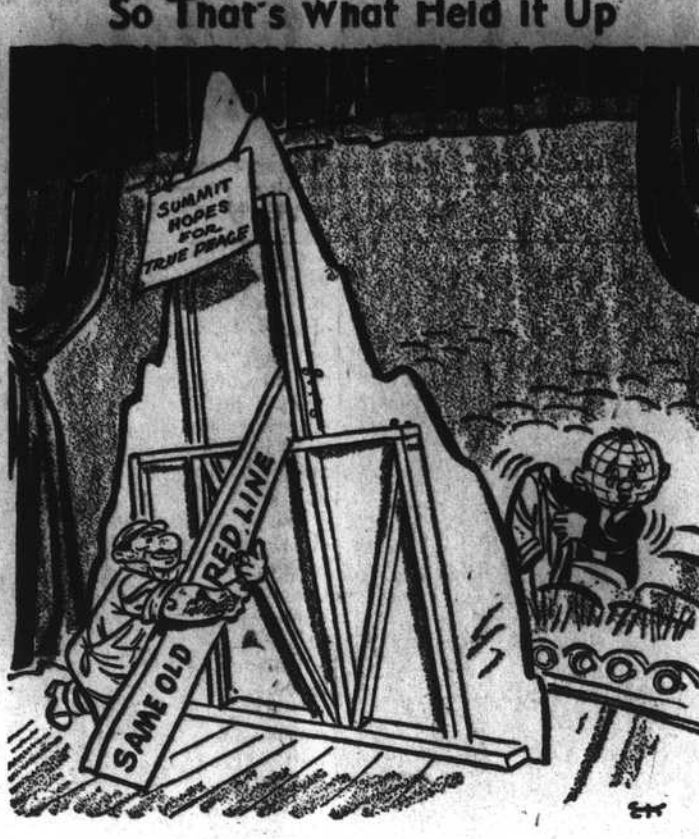

A Look Into the Future
Dr. Wilhelm Starlinger, noted German physician who was held in a Russian political prison for six years, until last year, has written a most absorbing book, dealing with Russia, Russia's future, and the motivations that move the Russian people.

Communist China and the United States must eventually reach some sort of an agreement, he says, and that will suddenly and immediately weaken the ties between Russia and China and pose Russia with the problem of possible discord on both fronts—the West and the East.
Only in Manchuria and northward and northwestward, can China find adequate living area. Eventually, then, Russia and China will face each other in the region of the Amur river.
