Seven One Half Per Cent Ammonia

Under certain restrictions in operations of the mills imposed by the United States Food Administration we find that it is to our advantage to make a smaller cut of linters which causes higher grade meal and because of this we are today changing our basis on meal to seven and one-half per cent ammonia, and will produce nothing lower as long as the present regulations are in force.

We have several hundred tons seven per cent meal which will be delivered according to contract.

The price established for seven per cent meal by the food administration is \$49.50 per ton f. o. b. mill in lots of thirty tons or more. Smaller lots \$2.50 per ton higher. This basis would make seven one-half per cent meal \$53.00 per ton in thirty ton lots.

We want wood at three dollars per cord at the mill.

After this week we will gin only on Wednesdays and Fridays, however, cotton can go into the stalls any day in the week.
