The new Board of County Commissioners were inducted into office the first Monday in December, and among the varied matters taken under consideration was the continuation of the services of Mr. L. B. Brandon as County Demonstration Agent for the year 1925.

Mr. Brandon upon information of their action went before them and asked them to create a County Board of Agriculture to aid and co-operate with him from all parts of the county, that the work may be more systematically, timely and efficiently done.

The plan as outlined for the organization is this: One man is wanted from every township—the best one possible in agricultural progressiveness, and who will take enough interest in the public welfare to measure up to the task.

Therefore look over your township, select your man, work for him, have him represented by petition or by friends at meeting of County Commissioners on afternoon of Monday, February 2, at 2 o'clock. Now this means you who read this, you who hear of it, and you who are farming, and interested in the welfare of your peoples and county, and you every township in the county, meet promptly.

With united effort and with co-operation, and with brain and brawn, combining a splendid citizenship, the latent resources of our splendid county can be made to bud and bloom, not as one of the hundred of the State, but as the best in progress and prosperity of them all.
