We see that the State Auditor's report shows that the wage commission has saved the State nearly \$200,000. But they didn't cut the salaries of any of these highups.

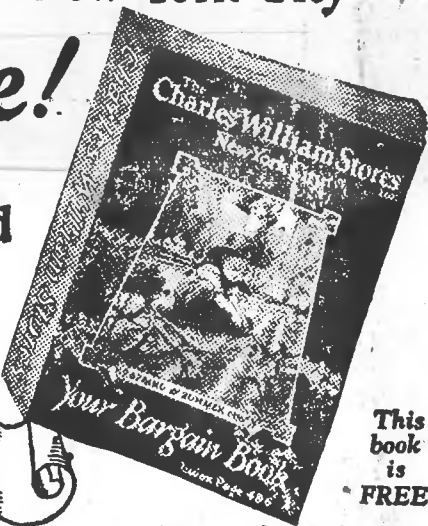
