The Kiwanis Club about the first of the year, appointed a committee to confer with J. E. Cox, regarding hardsurfacing more of Hoke highway. Recently Mr. Cox, assured members of this committee, that the Fayetteville road would be hard-surfaced at an early date, and that in a short time the balance of Route 70 would be finished. Another committee was appointed to confer with the highway authorities and see if the road from here to Elizabethtown, through St. Pauls, would not be taken over by the State. Nothing definite had been promised, but this committee has been assured that this road will be taken over if possible.

Va., Saturday, while on the way from Winston-Salem, N. C., to Chicago to face a charge of highway robbery, was still at large early today.

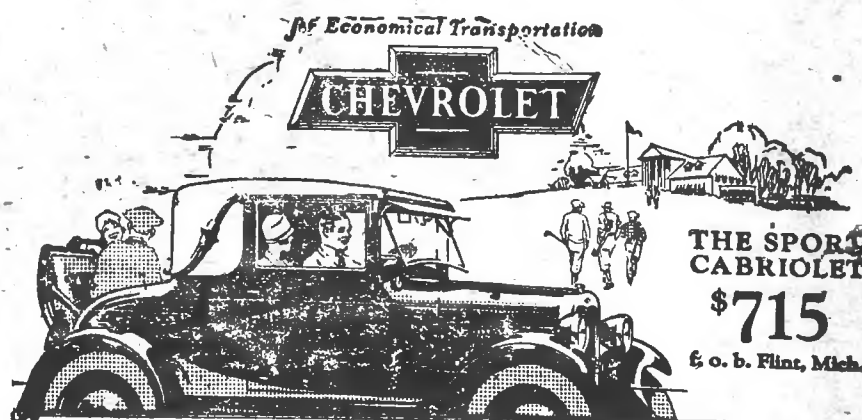
