### the Pension Boards.

The General Assembly of 1927 made certain changes in the pen sion laws of the state. A soldier who is totally of id or who has been paraly et in is totally disabled by f hereafter draw wear payable monthly through the Clerk of the Court, instead of \$300 00 as heretofore.

All other Confederate soldiers now on the pension roll, or who are eligible for pension under the general pension law, will draw one dollar a day, payable semi annually. The first payment will be in December 1927 and the second in June 1928.

The marriage date was also changed. A widow in order to be eligible for pension must have the pension roll by reason of some taken off.
