Local News Items.

Tobacco is averaging only
about 12 cents a pound on the
Eastern Carolina markets.

Rev. R. L. Davis, head of the
Anti-Saloon League in this state,
died at his home in Raleigh last
Thursday.

Rev. J. M. Daniel, pastor of
the Methodist church in Rock-
ingham, was found dead in bed
last Thursday morning. He was
49 years old.

It is said twenty millions of
government money is offered to
boost the price of cotton, but it
can only be had through co-op-
erative marketing associations.

The average price of tobacco
in this state in 1924 was 26 cents
a pound. Since it has gradually
fallen to 18c in 1928, but you
have seen no lower priced manu-
factured tobacco.

We certainly had a lot of rain
last Wednesday evening and
night, but we have an idea dry
weather will yet come between
now and Christmas, and it will
be a good fall for wheat growing.

After nine days work a jury
was selected to try the Gastonia
strikers that shot and killed Pol-
iceman Aderholt in Mecklen-
