

Small Grain for Feed and Winter Cover Crop

Most farmers are now experiencing a labor shortage. This problem is likely to increase by next year. In order to make the most out of the present available labor, farmers should consider planting larger acreage of small grain to replace part of the corn acreage, says A. S. Knowles, County Agent.

Barley, oats and wheat can be fed to livestock satisfactorily. These crops grow on land during the months of heaviest rainfall and reduce erosion that usually carries away plant food.

For grain, farmers should plant good seed of known variety. The varieties of barley that should be planted are Iredell 23, Tennessee No. 6 or Sunrise. The wheat varieties recommended are Carala and Redhart.
