#### Binder Twine Price Up

Binder twine prices will be somewhat higher this year, because of the increased cost of materials. Cordage and twine fibers, from which binder twine has been made in the past, are scarce. WPB and the U. S. Department of Agriculture have therefore encouraged use of part cotton yarn combined with benequin and sisal. These fibers are more expensive than materials formerly used.

#### Price Set on Tobacco Plants

"A regulation setting \$3.50 per thousand as the maximum price for flue-cured tobacco seedlings of certain types was issued, effective April 1," chairman of the local War Price and Rationing Board said.

The new regulation is designed to protect tobacco farmers from sellers demanding excessively high prices, and in some cases, as much as half-interest in the crop.

The regulation specifically prohibits the seller requiring as part of the purchase price that the buyer give the seller an interest in the tobacco to be produced from the plants sold.
