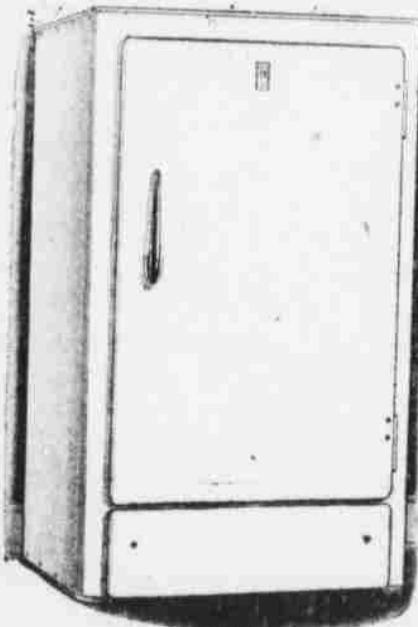

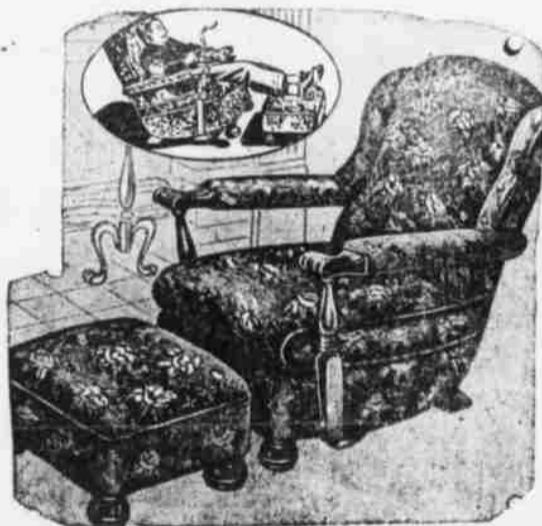

## Officers Needed For The Waac

The Women's Army Auxiliary Corps is launching a drive to secure women with outstanding qualifications to become Officers in the Corps. "Women with administrative experience and women with leadership ability are needed to serve as Officers in the rapidly expanding Women's Army Auxiliary Corps". Lt. Mary J. Norton, WAAC Recruiting Officer at Fort Bragg, announced today. "Although outstanding members in the ranks are entering Officer Candidate schools at the rate of 250 a week", she said, "many more Officers will be needed as soon as they can be trained."

"Pay and allowances are the same as Officers in the regular Army."

Applications are being accepted now from women interested in qualifying for Officers Candidate School. Major qualifications are as follows: An applicant must be a citizen of the United States, be 21 years of age or over, have 2 years of high school education or its equivalent, pass the Army Mental Alertness Test, pass the Army Physical Examination, submit proof of birth, and have no financial dependents. Applications for enrollment may be obtained from your local Post Office or by writing the WAAC Enrollment Station, Fort Bragg, N. C. They should be marked by the applicant in the upper right hand corner, "Officer Candidate", and returned to the Fort Bragg Office. Applicants will be furnished government transportation to Fort Bragg for the mental and physical examinations which require approximately two days time.

## "THE EVER-NORMAL POCKET-BOOK"

When the United States went to war the volume of consumer short-term debts had reached a high record of 9.7 billion dollars, a jump of a billion over the previous year. Shortly after the beginning of the war restrictions were placed on installment buying, all the way from furniture and store goods to automobiles and buying a home. Drastic restrictions have put crimps in installment credit. Restrictions and limitations on bank credits have been put into effect. New debts have been spaced out so they can be paid in small sums.

Mortgages have been paid off to an unusual degree since the beginning of the war. Debts have been reduced. The Office of War Information says it "helps to maintain the ever-normal pocketbook." More than that these limitations of credit may serve to impress the people of our country to bridge the gap between war and peace.

People who can—and do—save money should be quite "lucky-dun ky" in post-war times. But the rest of the population will look for the return of the "installment plan" and terms of credit that were good enough when they wanted radios, fires, and the comforts of home, or a way to meet their insurance premiums. There's a practical post-war program that deserves every attention.

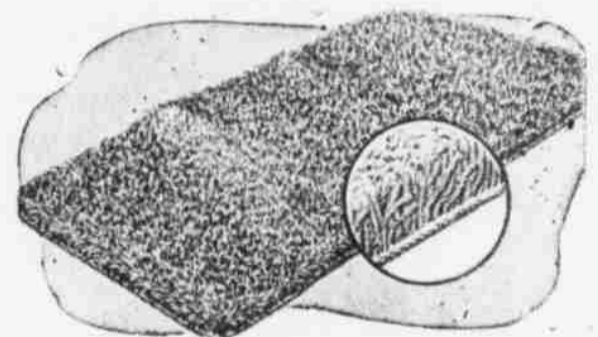
