

Open Sessions Investigation

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15.—A senate-house inquiry committee today is studying a set of suggested rules calling for a wide open investigation of the Pearl Harbor disaster.

A draft of proposed procedure, submitted to the committee last week by William D. Mitchell, its counsel, was ordered rewritten. But members said these main-points probably will be retained:

1. All evidence will be submitted at public hearings, where testimony will be under oath.
2. Any evidence the committee thinks has "probative force"—that is, proves a point—will be heard.
3. No personal attorney for a witness or government representative can object to questions by committee members or counsel nor interrupt questioning. But attorneys for witnesses can question them for the record after the committee gets through.
4. The state, war and navy departments will be given an opportunity to present any additional evidence they have after the committee completes its general testimony.

Army Recruiting Station Opened At Rockingham

All-Out Campaign Launched In State To Obtain Voluntary Enlistments.

1st Lt. John F. Cramp, Recruiting and Inducting Officer, U. S. Army Recruiting Sub-Station, Rockingham, District No. 2, Fourth Service Command, announced today the opening of an Army Recruiting station, located in the post office building.

S-Sgt. Victor Huggall with Sgts. Roman and Kraus and Cpl. William Castor on the staff complete the recruiting team.

Lt. Cramp said yesterday that men enlisting in the Regular Army may have their choice of the arm of service in which they served during the war. Men between the ages of 18 and 34 who are physically qualified may also pick their favorite arm or service. Overseas theatre assignments will be given those who desire such service in the theatre of their choice.

The men reenlisting or enlisting will be the guardian of Victory for which our men fought and died, Lt. Cramp said. At the same time these men will be preparing themselves for a career either in the army or in civilian life by the education and travel program now underway in this country and in overseas theatres.

The importance that these enlistments will have in carrying out to completion the tremendous task still before us in making sure of final victory, was stressed. Already throughout the state a large number of World War II veterans have signed up for the Regular Army.

The office hours at the sub-station will be from 8 a. m. to 5 p. m., daily.
