AIRLINES are ready to swing into action with these models, most of them war tested, but found new to civilian operations. a—Curtiss Commando (C46)—Largest twin-engine transport, gained war fame flying the "Hump." It will carry 40-45 passengers at 250 miles an hour. b—Martin Mars (J4M)—World's largest flying boat. Cruising at over 200 miles an hour, it can carry 100 passengers with a payload of more than 14 tons for over 3000 miles. c—Lockheed Constellation (C69)—Giant war transport and holder of a transcontinental record, can carry 64 passengers or considerably more people than shown standing under its 123-ft. wing span. d—Boeing Stratocruiser (B77)—Crossed continent in just over 6 hours. This counterpart of the Superfortress will carry 90 passengers at 350 miles an hour. e—Douglas DC4 (C54)—Workhorse of war-time transport will be among the first of newcomers to civilian use. Carries 44 passengers at 250 miles an hour. f—Consolidated Vultee "37"—Giant 270-passenger plane is 16 1/2 times size of present twin-engine airliner. Cruises at 340 miles an hour.
