Many Crops Show Slight Increases

North Carolina farmer produced
25,850,000 bushels of corn this year,
as compared with 51,018,000 bushels
in 1944; 819,790,000 pounds of to-
bacco as against 752,956,000 pounds
last year; 9,240,000 bushels of Irish
potatoes this season as compared with
6,970,000 bushels last season; and
6,745,000 bushels of peaches as con-
trasted with only 2,172,000 bushels
in 1944.

The production estimates are con-
tained in the annual report of the
Federal-State Crop Service in the N.
C. Department of Agriculture.

The hay crops this year is set at
1,281,000 tons as compared with
1,150,000 tons last year. However,
peanuts show a big reduction, 287-
850,000 pounds picked and threshed
this year as against 343,910,000
pounds in 1944. Cotton is down from
710,000 bales to 530,000 bales and
sweet potatoes went from 8,625,000
bushels in 1944 to 7,260,000 bushels
this year.
