
North Carolina farmer produced 5,650,000 bushels of corn this year, a compared with 51,018,000 bushels 1944; 819,790,000 pounds of to-co as against 752,956,000 pounds at year; 9,240,000 bushels of Irish statues this season as compared with 6,970,000 bushels last senson; and 6,745,000 bushels of peaches as conrasted with only 2,172,000 bushels

The production estimates are contained in the annual report of the Federal-State Crop Service in the N. C. Department of Agriculture.

The hay crops this year is set at 1.281.000 tons as compared with 1,150,000 tons last year. However, peanuts show a big reduction, 287,-850,000 pounds picked and threshed this year as against 343,910,000 pounds in 1944. Cotton is down from 710,000 bales to 530,000 bales and sweet potatoes went from 8,623,000 bushels in 1944 to 7,260,000 bushels bushels in 1944 to 7,260,000 bushels this year.
