'46 TOBACCO CROP SET MANY RECORDS

The 1946 crop of flue-cured tobacco set new records in several fields. W. P. Hedrick, tobacco marketing specialist with the N. C. Agriculture Department, reports.

In the first place, it was the largest crop in history. The average price for the season was 48 cents per pound—about 10 per cent higher than for 1945 and twice as high as the average price in the years from 1934-38.

Cash returns to growers for the 1946 crop were around \$640,000, 000 as against \$507, 000, 000 in 1945. During 1945-46 producers sales averaged \$354,000,000.

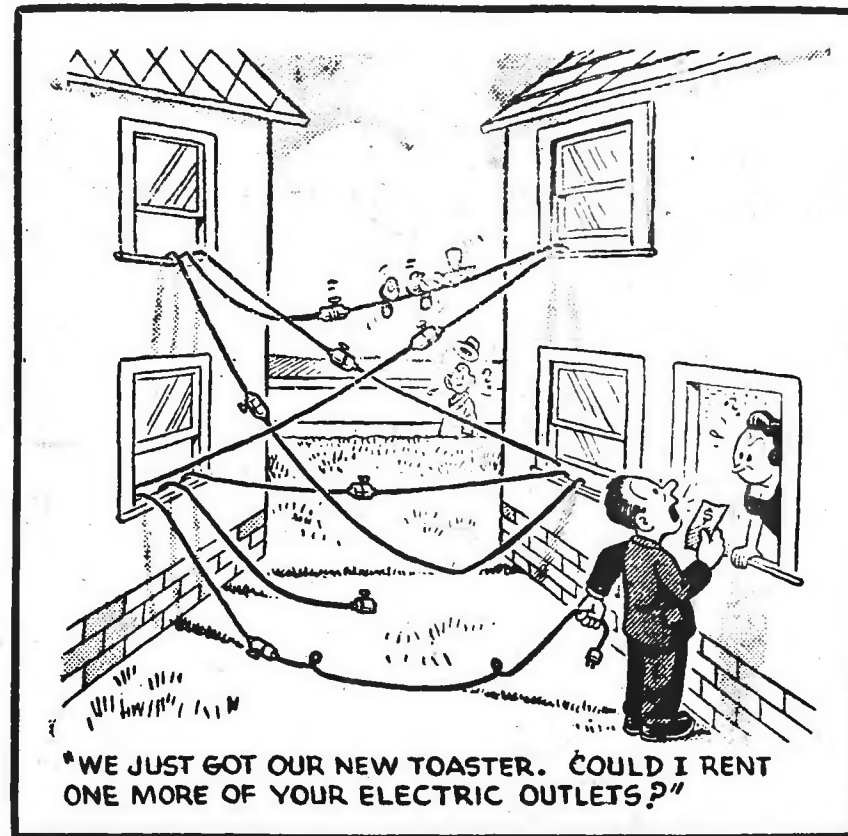

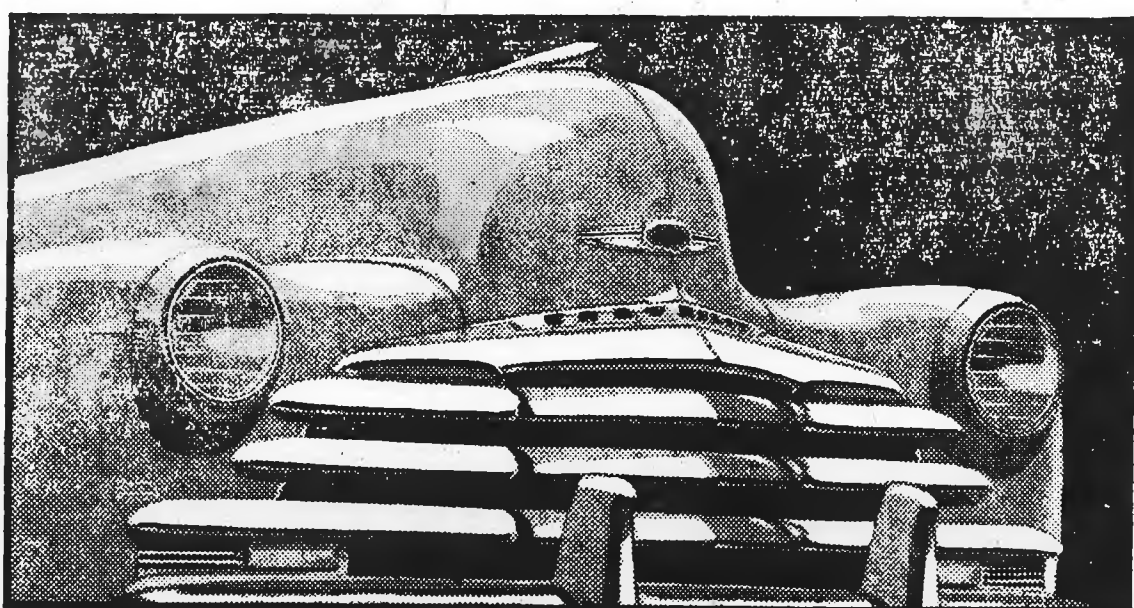
