### Report On Dental Clinic's

Dr. E. T. Koonce of the State Board of Health who is holding dental clinics in the white schools of the county makes the following report at the end of his first two weeks: Schools worked—Mildouson, Rockfish, Ashmont; Days worked, 10; Number children infected 250; Number of children treated 199; Number return patients, 1; No. children referred to local dentists, 250; No. amalgam fillings, 111; No. cement fillings, 31; No. silver nitrate treatments 309; No. teeth extracted, 149; No. children teeth cleaned, 199; No. lectures on oral hygiene, 9; Total

attendance on lecturing, 250; Total worked for who were repeaters, 52; Total worked for who were pre-school, 2.

We are glad to announce that the State Board of Health is allowing Dr. Koonce two additional weeks in Hoke County.

The Veterans Program of the Upchurch school has been in operation 11 months. When the program began on April 30, 1946 sixteen veterans were enrolled.

There are now 50 veterans enrolled, nine having been cut off for not doing satisfactory work. Classes are held at Bowmore Burlington, Upchurch schools twice weekly from 6:30 to 8:30 p. m. These trainees are supervised by their 3 full time instructors in their work on the farms.

A survey was made last fall and it was found that 8 of these veterans had a gross farm income of \$3,000.00 or more. The veterans now have over \$10,000 invested in livestock and machinery. They are cultivating this year 1,445.8 acres of land. One veteran has bought a small place of his own.

The three instructors of these veterans are college graduates. The veterans are divided educationally as follows: 1.2 years college, 6. high school graduation, 43 who range from third grade through the seventh. The average grade level being 6.9, practically 7th grade. The program is under the direction of Stephen Williams, teacher of vocational agriculture at the Upchurch High school. We think this program is going splendidly and hope that it will continue to do so.
