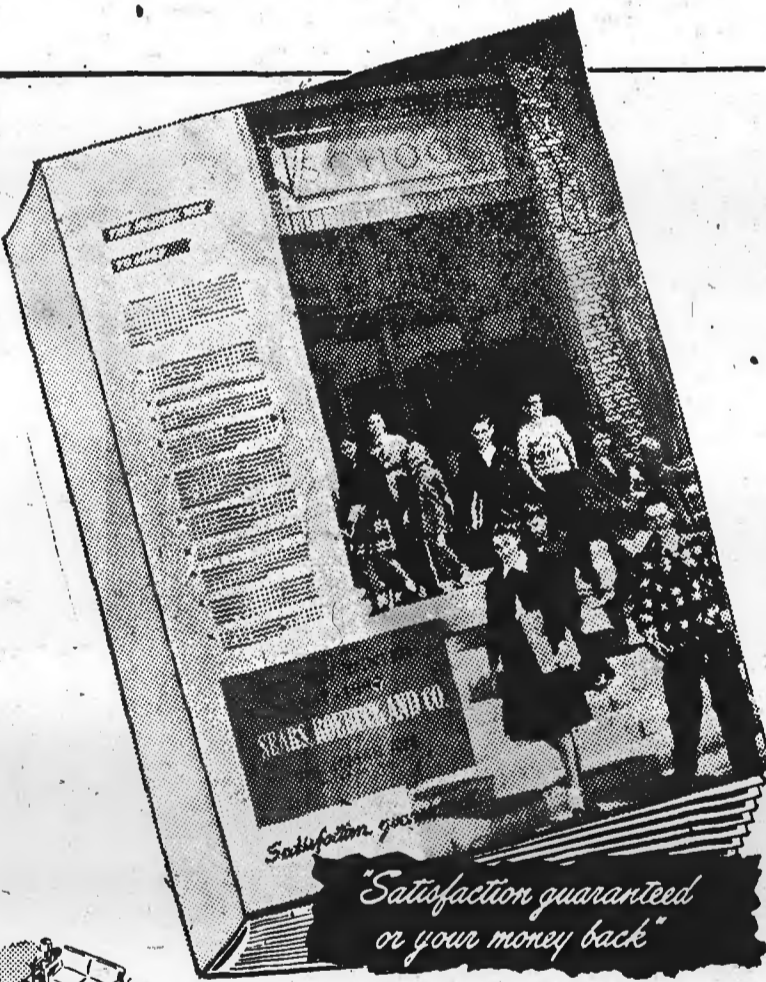

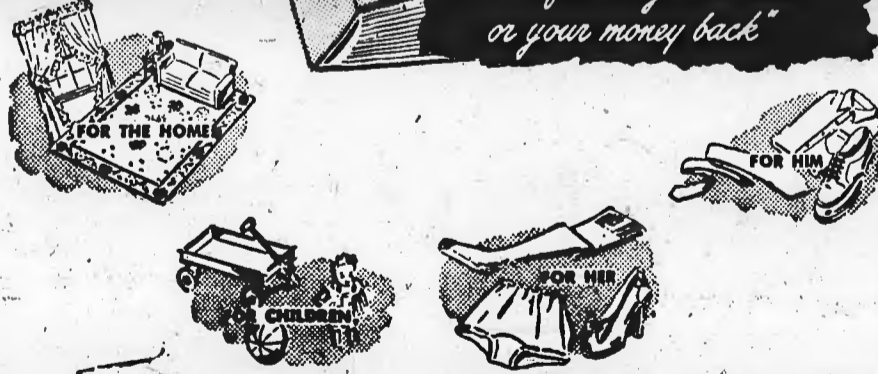

July 25 was the last day which may be counted for service in World War II in setting eligibility for veterans' benefits. On that date also stop-dates are set on GI benefits for those now eligible for them.

Persons entering the service henceforth will not be eligible for benefits under the GI Bill of Rights.

Stop-dates set on GI benefits are:

1. Education and job-training—Courses must be started not later than four years from July 25, must be completed not later than nine years hence.
2. Loan guarantees—These will be made for ten years. The government guarantees up to 50 percent on certain home, farm, and business loans.
3. Unemployment allowances—They stop two years hence.
