The following precautions to prevent fires are recommended by the Carolinas Ginners Association, which covers North and South Carolina and Virginia:

water supply. The expanded fac-Keep cotton as free as possible from matches and other foreign matter when picking; keep machinery, buildings and premises clean; allow no smoking in or around the gin; watch for chokes, tight seed roll, and change in the condition of cotton; don't gin cotton when wet; ground all metal and moving parts of the gin to eliminate static electricity; inspect all parts of the plant before closing and train your crew to know what to do in case of fire.
