Hoke County Pasture And Grazing Program 1947-1948

(PART II)

Supplementary Grazing Recommendations:

The permanent pasture should be supplemented with temporary grazing to prevent over grazing and to secure grazing for the longest possible time.

Fall And Winter Grazing:

1. Crimson Clover 15 pounds and Italian Rye Grass 25 lbs. per acre.

2. Italian Rye Grass - 40 pounds per acre.

3. A mixture of 2 bushels oats and 2 bushels barley or 4 bushels of either seeded alone.

4. A mixture of 1 bushel of rye, 2 bushels oats or barley (30 to 40 lbs. Italian Rye grass may be added.)

These crops should be seeded from Sept. 1 to Oct. 15 for best results. Plant on good land, well prepared. Inoculate clover seed. Fertilize with a 6-8-6 or 3-12-6 fertilizer at time of seeding at the rate of 300 to 400 pounds per acre. Top dress Nov. 1 or about 2 weeks after grain is up with 16 pounds of available nitrogen; repeat a-

about February 1. Summer Grazing

Kobe lespedeza should be planted from about February 10 to March 20, about 30 to 40 pounds per acre. 200 pounds of Superphosphate and 100 pounds of potash should be used. This can profitably be planted in a small grain crop.

Biloxi soybeans are recommended at a rate of 1 bushel in 2 foot rows. They should be planted between April 1 and May 15. 300 pounds of 3-10-6 should be used.

Pearl Millet should be seeded at a rate of 8 to 12 pounds in 18-inch rows between April 15 and July 15. 400 pounds 6-8-6 and 100 to 200 pounds nitrate of soda applied as side dressing.

Tift sudan grass should be seeded 10 to 12 pounds in 18-inch rows between April 15 and June 1 with some fertilizer as millet.

Home Agent's Narrative Report For September

Twelve Home Demonstration Clubs met in Hoke County in September with one hundred and thirty three women attending. The demonstration was on "Using the Sewing Machine Attachments". The seam guide, foot hemmer, adjustable hemmer, binder, tucker, ruffler, zipper foot, and buttonhole attachments were used. A cotton bag wardrobe loaned by the National Cotton Council was exhibited at six club meetings in September. The wardrobe consisted of fifteen children's and young ladies' garments made entirely from cotton bags. Many interesting reports

about Farm and Home Week were given by the women who attended from the various clubs.

The Home Agent attended a meeting of the USDA County Council and the Farm Bureau supper.

Four 4-H Club girls—Joan Sinclair, June Connell, Florence Cameron, and Freida Moss—gave a fifteen minute broadcast over Station WPTF in Raleigh.

The County Council of Hoke County Federation of Home Demonstration Clubs met in the assembly room of the County Office building on the afternoon of September 15. Mr. O. D. Fulp, Hoke-Moore County Sanitarian, spoke on Farm Home Sanitation, and showed two moving pictures "Water—Friend or Enemy" and a comedy on Farm Safety. The Council members voted to send seventy five Christmas gift packages to the children of Europe and Asia. Clothing of all kinds, small articles like soap, tooth paste, pins, etc. and toys are to be packed in towels that have been sewed up and made into a bag. Tags with the name and address of the sender and the articles enclosed will be placed on each bag. The gifts are to be brought into the Home Agent's office by October 15.

Final plans for next year's program of work were made and goals and objectives set up at the Council meeting.

A number of 4-H Club records were collected and checked to determine County winners.

One day in September was spent in Lumberton at a meeting for agents in the district.
