

The Nation's 1947 corn crop is estimated at 84,331,000 acres. This compares with an acreage of 88,-718,000 in 1946.


Pecan growers throughout the Nation are expected to produce about 104,271,000 pounds this year as compared with a production of 76,706,000 pounds last
