A new Navy rocket spurted 78 miles into the sky and reached a speed of 3,000 miles an hour, according to the Army and Navy. This is the highest and fastest that an American missile is disclosed to have gone. The performance of the new Navy rocket ,the Aerobee, greatly exceeds the altitude of 34 miles and speed of 2,100 miles of the only other American rocket so far announced. The rocket carried 150 pounds of instruments for recording sosmic ray activity.

FOREIGN TRADE

Commercial exports dropped in the Commerce Department. The Tuesday. January value of the exports was \$931,900,000, 11 per cent below last December. Imports, however, showed a brighter picture in January, totaling \$543,700,000, 14 per cent higher than the monthly average for 1947, although 10 per cent below the unusually high December value.
