selecting draftees to serve under the war. Out of 44,000 men examined since early November, 32,000 have been rejected. This is a rate of 72 per cent. It compares with the rejection rate of 35.8 per cent during the war.

> The Army, Navy and Air Force will start withholding of income taxes from the pay of all officers and enlisted men beginning January 1. Since 1942, the pay of enlisted personnel and Warrant Officers has been tax free, and commissioned officers have been allowed a \$1500 tax exemption. The last Congress, however, eliminated these provisions.


