What matters a great deal more is another structure this child is building—the invisible edifice of character. Will its foundation be deep and solid? Will the structure be strong and beautiful? Will it stand the strain of years of living? Will it stand firm if the fierce winds of misfortune blow and the rains descend upon it?

Fortunate is this child if in these early, formative years she is surrounded with the influences that help build strong character. Chief among such character-building influences has always been the Church. Within its walls the child learns reverence, truthfulness, honesty, fair play, unselfishness.



The Church is the greatest factor on earth for the building of character and good citizenship. It is a storehouse of spiritual values.
