Even if the puppy keeps a respectful distance, the house is quite likely to fall before it is finished. But it will have served its purpose. It will have given this child entertainment and manual dexterity.

What matters a great deal more is another structure this child is building—the invisible edifice of character. Will its foundation be deep and solid? Will the structure be strong and beautiful? Will it stand the strain of years of living? Will it stand firm if the fierce winds of misfortune blow and the rains descend upon it?

Fortunate is this child if in these early, formative years she is surrounded with the influences that help build strong character.
